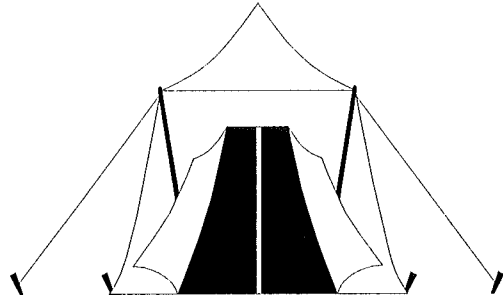

Welcome to the grandest Christian camping experience! (At least we think so.) If you are a 'newbie', we hope you love Creation as much as we do! It is our honor to accompany you to the 33rd Anniversary of Creation at Agape Farm Campground in Mt. Union, PA via our handy-dandy caravan of cars.

Creation is like a warm family reunion. Each year we see old friends and make new ones from across the world at the beautifully wooded Agape Farm. At the base of a small mountain is a grassy natural amphitheater used for the main stage. Hiking trails, mountain top lookout, panoramic view and camping is quite spectacular!

TAKE NOTE: Arrive at Creation about 2 P.M. on **WEDNESDAY, JUNE 29**. (Be prepared to wait in line!) We leave Creation before noon on **SUNDAY, JULY 3**. We form one great big gang of music lovers and Jesus seekers. Plan to get up close and personal with kids/adults in our personal "home-away-from-home" camp.

TAKE TIME: Wednesday afternoon is set up campsite, get to know each other and explore before evening concerts. It takes all of us to pitch tents, lift canopies and unload the 24' Ryder Truck. **Work assignments are given to each group so meals and camp clean up are completed quickly.** We stay until Sunday morning, breaking camp and traveling back to our various hometowns.

TAKE GEAR: Personal experience shows that anything can happen (and usually does) at Creation Festival. Prepare for extremely hot weather and prepare for rain. Pack summer clothing and a good pair of walking shoes! Don't forget a light jacket and umbrella. Since so much happens after dark, bring a flashlight and extra batteries. Bring a sleeping bag, pillow, towels and bathroom gear. **Bring money for 2 'on the road' lunches and souvenirs—spacious buildings are crammed with music, t-shirts, "fun stuff", vendors!** We bring delicious food but there is also tempting food/beverages at booths.

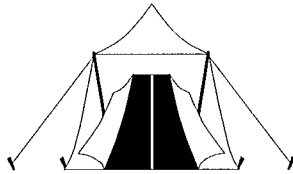
THE EXPERIENCE: Get ready to *party* with @ 80,000 of your closest friends and get ready to have your spiritual life changed from this “mountain top” experience.

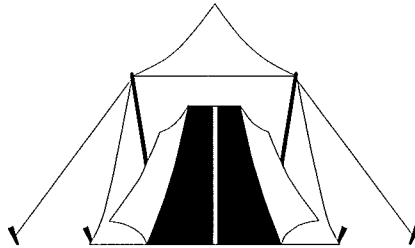

SAFETY!

Safety is a big priority at Creation.

The medical facility is staffed with qualified doctors and nurses who are available 24 hours per day to oversee your health. Security patrols take place 24 hours per day and include the presence of Pennsylvania State Police and Sheriff's office.

We require signed medical forms to give permission for emergency care if the need arises!

DAILY WORK ASSIGNMENTS

Each small group is responsible for **ONE MEAL** during the week. From preparing the meal to doing dishes to keeping the grassy areas free from litter, help your team and enjoy the rest of the week chore free!

We ask that your team set up the meal, clean tables, and do everything necessary to make the camp site look fresh and clean before you leave.

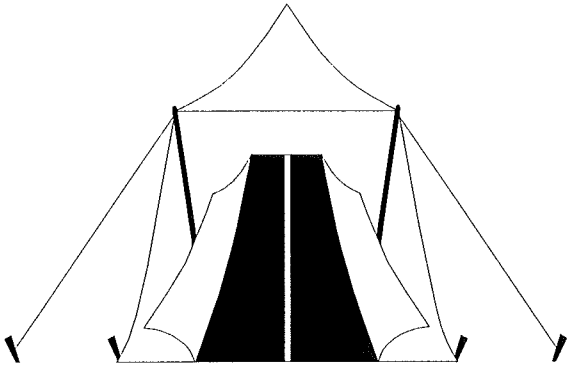
Many hands make light work.

TIPS FOR CREATION LEADERS!



We are excited to have you join us for CREATION FESTIVAL! Here are a few details before we hit the road. Because there are 80-100,000 people (literally strangers) at the Agape Farm, we have safety guidelines while still giving teens as much freedom as possible. It helps to know what is expected to keep our camp running smoothly.

Expect the best behavior. Establish a “go to” leader for personal problems (health, behavior, money, relationships). All campers are expected to return to camp no later than 30 minutes after the last concert. Campfire, music and wondrous snacks will be waiting. If anyone wants to go to Late Night Café, be sure they check in and go with others. **No one leaves our camp site alone.** Small groups of two or more must travel together to all activities (day or night).

Set up. As soon as you arrive, find **Pastor Dave** and get jobs to pitch tents, unload trucks and make our four day home liveable as quickly as possible. Until all tents/canopies are up and gear is neatly stowed, no one leaves. **Hill Memorial** prepares sandwiches, chips, fruit, beverage to be served ASAP.

Girls and boys tents remain private. Some campers want to sleep or change clothing or get away from the crowd. All socializing occurs under the giant canopy or at the campfire. One leader in each tent must know where each person is during the night. No wandering couples all night! Sleep is important!

Daily chores are completed by teams. When your group is responsible, organize adults and teens who prepare the meal, do dishes, clean the kitchen area and police grassy areas.

Everyone is expected to attend lunch devotions. Campers may choose to sleep in the morning and miss the breakfast buffet. Cereal, fruit and milk will be offered through breakfast hours. Do not expect breakfast to be served all morning!

Medications and Health Care. Each camper takes care of personal medications. If help is needed, assign one leader as “nurse”. There is a health facility staffed by volunteer doctors and nurses at Agape Farm. Encourage campers to drink water all day to avoid dehydration.

Bathrooms/Showers. We rent one bathroom stall for our group. We have two large showers that are a welcome camp addition. Each shower contains a small dressing room separate from the shower on a wooden platform. Take showers at various times during the day to avoid long lines and lack of water. Think WATER CONSERVATION! There are outdoor bathrooms and permanent showers all over Agape Farm which may be used by all groups.

Ticket Bracelets. Tickets have been purchased. The Creation Bracelet must be worn at all times. Tell campers to fit their bracelet loosely for comfort and...don't lose it!

WATER! It takes five gallons of water to keep one person hydrated. We make cold beverage available all day. Agape Farm water is drinkable but has a sulfur taste. We store fresh water in the 24' Ryder truck that will be on site with us and will provide water.

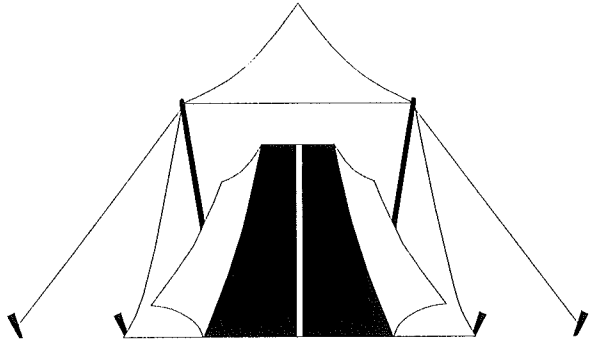
We shop daily in Mt. Union, PA. When supplies are needed, a car goes to Mt. Union each day. We buy ice as needed. There is a fully stocked grocery store and other shopping areas in the town. Forgetting something will not cause a crisis.

We'll just “go shopping”!

SATURDAY NIGHT STYRO AWARDS

We reserve the last campfire on the last night for the presentation of STYRO AWARDS! Our kids look forward to it so much that we dare not break tradition. Based on behavior, personalities and Creation experiences we award white styrofoam cup awards with name/award/stickers personally inscribed.

Past awards include *The Just Leave Me Alone and Let Me Sleep Award*, *The Best Testimony Award*, *I Can Go All Week Without a Shower Award*, *I Love Jesus Best Award*, *Messiest Tent*, ...you get the idea. Cups, markers, stickers, etc. are available to leaders on Saturday. Catch your gang acting great.



GEAR SUGGESTIONS

Bring only the items you need! Packing and tent space is at a premium. Come prepared for all kinds of weather...hot, cold and wet. Dress simply and modestly. If you forget something important, tell a leader. It may be possible to borrow it or purchase it in Mt. Union. NO electricity so hair dryers, etc. cannot be used.

We bring white, plastic chairs for the campsite. You may bring a collapsible chair, blanket or tarp to carry to concert and speaker arenas.

The campsite has private porta-potty, 2 showers + water tower, 18 x 20 canopy, small kitchen canopy, 1-24' Ryder truck, 8-10 tables, white chairs, fire ring with wood, tent city, 1 trailer, several vehicles (most vehicles must be parked off-site to make room for tents.)

TOP TEN CAMP RULES FOR CREATION 2011

1. **Everyone** helps with camp chores. Follow the daily list and be prepared to help. Follow directions of the leaders. **Everyone helps with camp clean up, every day.** Pick up all litter! Keep tables clean!

2. Keep your belongings in your suitcase and keep your suitcase in the tent for safety—and neatness! This is not the time to scatter your stuff throughout the tent or camp site.

3. Never leave camp without a buddy. This is important! Do not travel from camp site to camp site or to any concert or seminar alone!



4. All campers must return to the camp site no later than 30 minutes after the final event each evening. We will be waiting to see your face!

5. You are responsible to communicate people problems or physical illness to a leader. You are responsible for your own medications. Ask for help as needed.



6. When helping with a meal and clean up, show up 30 minutes before the meal. Remain and be helpful until the camp site is clean and all food is put into coolers, dishes are done and garbage is bagged.

7. Every Creation camper may choose a Main Stage-Fringe Stage concert to attend with a small group and counselor. The counselor is responsible for your group. People in the groups may change with each event so find out where everyone is going and....tag along.

8. Every Creation camper should attend one seminar each afternoon. These are some of the greatest speakers in the nation! Don't miss anything!

9. Get enough sleep to enjoy the daily events. Girls and guys tents are off limits to the opposite sex. There are some who want to change clothing, rest, sleep or just have privacy in their personal space. All socializing is done at the campfire or under the large canopy. Visit outside the tents!



10. Have fun! Have the best time of your life! Make new friends! Keep the old friends! Wear your faith on your face and in your heart!
